The recent parent evenings were very positive and it was great to see them so well attended and having the opportunity to chat with many of you. Thank you to the PTA for providing refreshments and for the governor representatives who were available during both evenings. Year 1 & 2 definitely knew how to end the half term, they enjoyed a fantastic "Pirate Day" and the activities and outfits made for a great fun day - fortunately we had kind pirates, no plank walking for me!

May I take this opportunity to thank all our responsible dog owners for following the school's guidance about dogs in the school grounds. As this system is working so well, the governors and school are happy for it to be extended indefinitely.

Parent Questionnaire Feedback

We strongly believe that All Saints' is a very successful school and that children are encouraged to enjoy all their learning experiences and achieve their best. We are proud to "Learn hand in hand together -with God". We are also thankful for feedback to enable our school to develop and continue to move forward and you may recall the parent questionnaire completed in July this year. Although there was a small response from parents, along with the Governors and staff, I have read your comments and note that the main point perceived was lack of communication between the school and yourselves. I know that many of you readily contact school and meet or talk to either me or staff but I would like to share with you a response from the feedback:

- The new website is now up and running, which is far more informative and easier to use. We were unfortunately tied to the previous site for a number of years but that contract has now finished. The new website will hold everything you need to know, such as term timetables, holiday forms, newsletters, current information and policies etc.
- 2. The suggestion box is still situated in the main entrance and we continue to encourage you to bring any ideas, comments or concerns to our attention.
- 3. We are aware that parents may want to arrange to see a member of staff and therefore we have reminded you of how to make contact with staff in our newsletters and on the website.
- 4. There will be an additional celebratory newsletter each term to reflect purely on children's achievements and we will copy these onto the website so you can see what they have been up to.
- 5. Although we already share certain celebrations with parents, after the Christmas festivities, parents will be invited to attend their child's class Collective Worship. We only have so much space in the main hall so the invitation will be sent out by class over the year.
- 6. We would like your input on decisions made for our children, therefore we will be introducing a Head Teacher forum to invite parents' ideas on a particular topic that is relevant at the time. The first forum will be held on Wednesday 26 November at 9am in the hall and the discussion point will be about healthy snacks in school.
- 7. We would like to confirm that at all parents' evenings I am available for you to come and talk to me with any issues, but we will also have a Governor at each meeting, so that you can come and meet them too.
- 8. In July we will once again be holding transition meetings for parents of KS1 children moving up to year one and the move upstairs to year 3. The year 3/4 classes will continue to invite parents after school in the new term to look round the class and the cloakroom area.
- 9. Over the year we will be holding curriculum evenings to explain the new national curriculum and how maths and literacy are taught dates will follow shortly.

10. Although we already have many different ways for parents to be involved with school, we will be asking for a voluntary register of talents and professions of adults for school to tap into. This will be a great way to enhance the learning opportunities for the children and to strengthen further our home-school links.
