Head Lice

We have had several calls over the past week relating to cases of head lice in school. All types of hair can be affected, regardless of its length and condition. Head lice often cause a person's scalp to itch, caused by an allergy to the lice. However, not everyone is allergic to head lice, so you or your child may not notice a head lice infestation. Head lice can be difficult to see, even when the head is closely inspected. To confirm an active head lice infestation, a louse must be found through a reliable, accurate method, such as detection combing.

Head lice can usually be effectively treated with lotions or sprays designed to kill head lice, or by wet combing, using a specially designed head lice comb. As well as checking your child's hair regularly, we would also recommend that long hair is tied back whilst at school in order to minimise the spread.
