# SATs

The KS2 Year 6 SATs tests will take place on;

Once again the writing aspect of the Year 6 SATs will be solely based on Teacher Assessment and not through a one off writing test. This enables a true and accurate picture of each child's writing ability to be assessed and moderated both within school and with colleagues from our local schools. We are confident that this will benefit the children and give an informed level of their written work from across the whole year.

Test

SATS are only a snapshot of your child's ability on a particular day and we prepare and encourage them to try their best and "show off" their skills, however we also send teacher assessment information to the next schools and this helps to give a true reflection of your child's ability over time. Year 2 children will also be taking the KS1 SATs during May and these will be fully teacher assessed and the children will not be aware of tests and tasks but only "special" pieces of work. Confirmation of your child's SATs level will be given in their end of year report. The national expected level for year 6 is level 4 and for year 2 is level 2.

#### **Class Allocation Procedure**

Well in advance of the class allocations, we wanted once again to explain how classes are decided and how children are allocated to them, particularly from EYFS and KS1. We are conscious that some parents find this a difficult time and we want to reassure you that much thought and consideration is taken by staff because decisions are based on each individual child's needs. Children are placed into the class that best suits their learning style and not based on age, academic ability or solely friendships. The process is slightly more complex because we are a 1 <sup>1</sup>/<sub>2</sub> form entry school. Most EYFS children will move up to the year 1 class with some of the more independent learners being put into

the mixed year 1/2 class. However all the children across the 3 classes in KS1 will access the same topics and staff plan, mark and moderate together to ensure everyone covers the same curriculum. Please can I assure you that the class your child is given is based on the professional judgment of our dedicated staff and that we accept and respect their decision. We will provide class allocations along with the annual progress report towards the end of the summer term and coincide "move up morning" before reports are distributed and therefore the children will be familiar with their new class, teacher and friendships and be able to discuss them with you. We will also be holding a Key Stage 1 and 2 short transition meeting for parents towards the end of the summer term.
