REMINDERS

COMMUNICATION WITH STAFF

Should you have a concern about anything related to your child – be it pastoral, academic or otherwise, please contact the office by email (<u>office@allsaintsilkley.bradford.sch.uk</u>) or phone (01943 607852) so a message can be passed onto the child's class teacher and/or group teacher (Years 3 - 6).

This system allows for efficient communication and also marries with our efforts to keep visitors to a minimum. Once they receive any messages, teachers will endeavour to get in touch with within a reasonable timeframe. If your concerns are more urgent, we will, of course, deal with them more quickly.



LUNCHTIME

Our lunchtime routines have undergone a huge change to accommodate the size of each bubble group in school (i.e. four bubble groups consisting: foundation, Year 1/2, Year 3/4 and Year 5/6).One aspect of this is that some pupils who bring a packed lunch are currently eating outdoors in set areas of the playground. We have the benefit of shelter in many areas of school and contingencies are in place should the weather deteriorate. A balance is necessary here as time outside is advised wherever possible as it limits infection amongst individuals. Some schools have chosen to eat in classrooms, but this would brings its own organisational challenges such as enhanced cleaning measures.

STAGGERED STARTS AND ENDS OF DAYS

You may have seen in the media that staggering starts and ends of days (as well as break times in school) is one of the essential measures recommended by the government to limit the spread of infection.

After a couple of days of settling in, our morning and after school routines are becoming more refined each day - thank you for your patience.

We are pleased to have remained consistent with our correspondence back in July about timings of staggered drop offs and pick ups. However, we must also make a polite plea to parents and carers to stick to their allotted times and to maintain social distancing.

We are fully aware that, until Foundation stage pupils start full time on September 21st, there will be more Year 1 and 2 pupils being dropped off at Westville Rd in the morning (rather than Easby Drive). It is therefore even more important that those in the 9.00 am slot wait until then to drop off their child.

Can we also remind you that dogs are not permitted on the school grounds. Thank you again!
