Curriculum

Our Curriculum aims to provide children with the skills and knowledge necessary to be confident, successful and responsible global citizens in the 21st Century. We provide a stimulating curriculum which motivates the children to become multi-faceted individuals with the ability to think for themselves.

Our curriculum will provide learning which steers children towards developing;

- Essential learning skills
- Ability to be creative and resourceful
- Ability to work both individually and collaboratively
- A positive awareness of their own identity and self-worth
- Secure values to enable them to make appropriate choices in life

Schools Visits and Visitors

The Curriculum is regularly enriched with wonderful first hand experiences that support and enhance each area of study with visits to places of worship, theatres, parks, museums, the local environment, workshops, sports events and many more. In Year 5 and Year 6 the children take part in a residential visit to adventurous outdoor activity centres – this promotes strong bonds and team building among the children, peers and staff.

Religious Education

We are a Voluntary Controlled Church of England School and place RE and Christian Collective Worship central to daily life and to the development of the whole child. We expect all children to take an active part however parents do have the right to withdraw their child from RE and Collective Worship in consultation with the Headteacher and a formal exemption will be required.

Through our school ethos, curriculum and vision we openly value differences and celebrate the uniqueness of each individual and endeavour to offer opportunities and challenges to everyone.

Assessment

Assessment is continual and ensures that each child's progress is tracked and their targets are achieved. Through assessment, children are proactive in their learning and confident to challenge themselves and set ambitious targets. Assessment is also vital to inform staff of where and what needs to be taught. Targets, attainment and progress are reported annually to parents.

Alongside thorough teacher assessments, children in Year 2 and Year 6 follow the nationally devised Standard Assessment Tasks (SATs) in Literacy and Numeracy.

Behaviour

We expect and encourage children to behave in an appropriate manner and to make good choices. Our school rules are simple but effective and ensure that we always enjoy outstanding behaviour, respect and manners;

- We always try to do our best
- We treat other people as we would want to be treated ourselves
- We respect other people's property and look after our own
- We remember times when we should be silent
- We always walk in our school.

Successes

All successes are shared and enjoyed through a variety of class and whole school celebrations. Children are encouraged to be proud of achievements from a diverse range of activities, both inside and outside school.

Healthy School

Healthy eating - Our aim is to promote healthy eating and to make breaks and lunchtime a safe and enjoyable experience. Our excellent school lunches are locally-sourced and provide delicious homemade, nutritionally balanced meals cooked in our 5 Star Hygiene Award kitchen. Children in KS1 are offered a free piece of fruit at morning break and the children's School Council operate a healthy snack Tuck Shop for children in Key Stage 2.

Healthy bodies and minds – our fantastic adventure playgrounds, wild garden, MUGA and wooded area encourage all the children to be fully active during breaks. Through whole school strategies to promote social and emotional wellbeing, nurture, cooperation and friendship are an integral part of school life.
