

**Instrument of Government
Ilkley All Saints' Church of England
Voluntary Controlled Primary School**



1. The name of the school is ILKLEY ALL SAINTS' CHURCH OF ENGLAND VOLUNTARY CONTROLLED PRIMARY SCHOOL
2. The school is a Voluntary Controlled school.
3. The name of the governing body is "The governing body of Ilkley All Saints' Church of England Voluntary Controlled Primary School.
4. The governing body shall consist of:
 - a. 2 parent governors
 - b. 1 LA governor
 - c. 1 staff governor
 - d. 1 headteacher (except at any time when the Headteacher has given notice that s/he chooses not to be a governor)
 - e. 2 foundation governors
 - f. 2 co-opted governors
5. The total number of governors is 9
6. Foundation governors are appointed by Diocesan Board of Education for the Diocese of Leeds.
7. The holder of the following office shall be a foundation governor ex officio:

The Principal Officiating Minister of the benefice of Ilkley All Saints'

(b) The Diocesan Board of Education for Leeds Diocese shall be entitled to appoint a foundation governor to act in the place of the ex officio foundation governor whose governorship derives from the office named in (a) above, in the event that that ex officio foundation governor is unable or unwilling to act as a foundation governor, or has been removed from office under regulation 21(1) of the Regulations.
8. The foundation governors themselves, after consultation with the Diocesan Board of Education for Leeds Diocese, are entitled to request the removal of any ex officio foundation governor.
9. A Trust Deed exists for this school.

10. Ilkley All Saints' Church of England Voluntary Controlled Primary School is a school designated as one having a religious character and whose ethos is derived from a Church of England Foundation.

Recognising its historic foundation, the school will preserve and develop its religious character in accordance with the principles of the Church of England and in partnership with the church at parish and diocesan level.

The school aims to serve its community by providing education of the highest quality within the context of Christian belief and practice. It encourages an understanding of the meaning and significance of faith and promotes Christian values through the experience it offers to all its pupils.

11. This instrument of government comes into effect on 1 October 2021
12. This instrument was made by order of the City of Bradford Metropolitan District Council.
13. A copy of the instrument must be supplied to every member of the governor body (and the headteacher if not a governor), any trustees and to the appropriate religious body.
