A huge thank you to all our parents for your extraordinary generosity and to our amazing staff for being such good sports.




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Year 2 have been looking at landmarks in both Australia and the UK. In art, they created their own landmarks using a variety of materials.



His innovative technique won him the Gold Medal at the Mexico City Olympics. Unfortunately, he died
