'Invacuation' – keeping children safe in school

As a school we place the safety of the children as a high priority and we are constantly testing and revising our planning arrangements. Over the coming weeks we will be testing and reviewing our invacuation procedures. An invacuation is a way of keeping children safe by gathering them in pre-identified 'safe spaces' should there be a need to. Examples of when an invacuation may be necessary include if there was a wild animal in the school grounds or a chemical leak in the local area. We hope to never need to use the procedure but by regularly reviewing and practising, as we do with 'fire drills', we know that our procedures work and the children are familiar with what to do.

Before we carry out the invacuation drill we will speak with the children and explain, in an age appropriate way, what we will be doing and why.
