


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## **Dear Parents and Carers**,

We have been working hard in Art to use fabric and other materials








weave together and create our landscape pictures. These techniques proved to be harder than we thought. However, we are very proud of our results.



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
Year 4 are beginning their maths topic on fractions, they have been investigating equal and unequal parts.
