Mrs. Wood talked to us about how to identify the range of trees in the woods. She showed us which leaves were safe to eat! Some of the children wanted to try the hawthorn leaves. They were supposed to taste like 'bread and butter' but we didn't think that they did! {The children were told only to try these with Mrs. Wood who is a forest school leader!} There was a slack line suspended in between two trees and we had to try and balance from one side to the other. Our new topic explores hot and cold areas in the world and in art we have created cold world watercolour paintings in art.








Year 2

French Challenge day, where the children were emersed in
the French language building on our knowledge of French
monuments in Paris. They were set the challenge of

recreating one of the monuments out of junk

modelling. Their knowledge of strengthening materials and ideas for connecting were put to the test. The children worked together in teams and excelled in their

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Year 3 then completed their linking schools visit, where we had been invited to join the children from Copthorn Primary in Bradford. This was a day fill with sharing stories, making new friends, developing communcation and understanding how



we all live together in one community. Many laughs were enjoyed and a rather enjoyable (and hot) day was had by all.



As it is the start of a new term, we embarked on a new journey in our learning of Science and Geography. You may have seen the Curriculum newsletter where we are finding out about Rocks and Soils and Volcanoes and Earthquakes. This week we began looking at igneous rock and how it cools from Magma. We investigated this using chocolate mixed with a little oil and poured over ice to see the effect of 'quick cooling.' We found this very exciting and realised the properties of the rock. We had a lot of keen Geologists

in the making 😉

Year 4 also enjoyed the excitement of their new unit for the half term, where they will be exploring the depths of rainforest. This began for 4F following their collective worship this week where parents helped to create an amazing array of rainforest wildlife for their display.
