### News from LKS2

Our final two weeks in school have been filled with lots of excitement and creativity.





In year 3, we have continued to be inspired by artists such as Andy Warhol and Nick Rowland. Looking at tint, tone and texture, we have created our own volcano art pieces by using paint and other materials to create depth to our pictures. We are very proud of the exploding work we have created!



Our English writing has taken us into the mysteries and myths of legends, as we have been reading *When the Giant Stirred.* We have been focusing greatly on language and vocabulary this term, examining the authors choice of words and their meanings. We have gone on to publishing our own legend stories, using our imagination to develop our settings and characters.

We have finished learning all about rocks, soils and fossils this week! It has been wonderful to see the children so engaged, with many bringing in their own fossils from home to share. To further enhance their knowledge, we made our own fossils using salt, flour and coffee!





Finally, we have moved on to our final maths topic of the year; shapes! The children have been using their knowledge from Year 2 to build on their understanding of right angles and 3D shapes.







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4F managed to dodge the wet weather and have lots of fun developing their knowledge of the outdoors in Forest schools. The children were enthusiastic and supportive of one another throughout the session and showed great resilience when trying to set a piece of cotton wool on fire using a flint and steel.

As we come to the end of our geography topic on the

Rainforests, we have been debating about the impact, and the pros and cons of deforestation. The debates have shown the care and compassion that we have towards the preservation of our planet.




### Year 6 production – I'm an 11-year-old ... get me out of here!

'her' application, having failed the tapioca test. We wish her luck in her future culinary endeavours.


