On Thursday 5th October, the Year 3 children had a fantastic day at Nell Bank. Through first-hand experience, the children discovered just how challenging life was during the Stone Age period



The day was full of exciting activities, with the morning spent practicing how to light a fire using a bow drill, flint and

steel. Using artefacts and hands-on activities based in the Roundhouse, the children had an opportunity to create their own cave paintings, and

discover essential tools for survival, such as using natural materials to weave everyday



useful objects.

Finally, the day finished with the children working in small groups to use natural materials to build their own den shelter.



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<u>Ilkley Manor House</u> Our 'Roman army' of Year 4 pupils marched over to the Manor House on the afternoon of Wednesday 11th October to find out about Ilkley's history as a Roman fort. As well as seeing the remains of the fort wall behind the building, they investigated artefacts and discovered many unknown facts about the town they all go to school in!
