Phonics Success



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Year 3 visit to Abbey House Museum

The children took over a Victorian courtroom, where they had to decide the fate of a young boy caught stealing a loaf of bread. After giving a guilty verdict, they were sentenced to time in a real Victorian prison cell. An exciting day was had by all whilst strengthening our knowledge of rich and poor Victorian Yorkshire.





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Leave of Absence requests

As a headteacher I receive many Leave of Absence requests during term time. Our Attendance Policy sets out clearly that Leave of Absence during term time will only be approved in exceptional circumstances. Examples provided as 'exceptional' are:

- Service personnel returning from a tour of duty abroad where it is evidenced the parent will not be in receipt of any leave in the near future that coincides with school holidays.
- Where an absence from school is recommended by a health professional as part of a parent's or child's rehabilitation from a medical or emotional issue.
- The death or terminal illness of a person close to the family.
- To attend a wedding or funeral of a person close to the family.

These 'exceptional' circumstances are different to what would be classified as 'special' circumstances which do not meet the criteria, such as celebrations for a milestone birthday for example.

Often, where Leave of Absence is sought for exceptional circumstances, additional information and documentation is required, where possible, please do ensure this is included with the application.
