Twister.








The grand total raised was a spectacular £580!! So a huge thank you to everyone for their generous donations and to School Council for organising the event.

The girls completed their league fixtures last week with a double-header against Menston and Addingham. With referees in short supply for the first match vs Menston, Mr P had to step in to officiate the first half - no bias was evident in his decisions! Hattie put All Saints ahead before half-time with a great break and finish in off the far post. Two more quick goals were added early in the second half – Rosa, then Erin slotting home. The performance from all the team was excellent throughout, with regular rotation of the subs possible as we were so in control. The moment of the match came very late on as Hattie broke free again, shot against the inside of the post, watched as the ball rebounded across goal onto the other post and came back to her... only for her follow-up shot to force the Menston keeper into an extraordinary reflex save to tip the ball wide!

The second match of the evening was far more competitive against a well-organised, and very physical, Addingham side. With both teams battling fiercely, Emily finished excellently after Hattie's shot had been saved, to give All Saints the lead at half-time.
