WORD	DEFINITION	<p>World War 1 began on the 28th July 1914 and lasted until the 11th November 1918</p> <p>Over 8 million soldiers died in the First World War</p> <p>As the men fought in the war, women were able to work in roles previously considered 'masculine' for the first time (this included farming, shop work and office work such as typewriters)</p> <p>250 men and women from Ilkley sacrificed their lives in WW1</p> <p>62 Belgium Refugees came to Ilkley during the war</p> <p>When war first broke out in 1914, children still got up and went to school, did their homework and played with their friends. However many children were very sad and scared at this time as their brothers and fathers were away at war and they lived in fear of invasion or attack which could also result in them having to move out of their homes. They had no TV's and not many had radios, and food and clothing were scarce.
