

Fairy Tales Narrative poetry	Geometry: Shape, Position and Direction.	What do Hindu people believe about God? The children explore Hindu beliefs about Brahman, the Aum symbol, and how different deities represent aspects of one divine reality. They show respect for diverse faiths, compassion when discussing beliefs, perseverance in understanding complex ideas, and service through thoughtful reflection and discussion.	
<p>A poetry unit exploring myths and monsters through reading, performing and writing. Children analyse poetic forms, rhythm and line breaks, develop personal responses, dramatise poems, retell myths, compose sonnets and haiku, and create their own anthologies using collaborative drafting and editing.</p>		<p>Covering angles, lines, shapes, polygons, 3-D forms, perimeter; plus coordinates, translation, symmetry, and reflection, developing accuracy in plotting, measuring, describing movements, and identifying shape properties across grids and diagrams.</p>

<p>This term, children explore how plants and animals grow, change, and reproduce. They will show compassion and respect for living things, demonstrate perseverance when investigating life cycles, and show service by caring for the natural world and sharing their learning responsibly with others.</p>			
<p>Children explore their strengths, responsibilities, and contributions to the school community. They show respect for others' abilities, compassion when supporting peers, perseverance in developing new skills, and service by recognising how their actions help build a positive, caring environment.</p>			

<p>Computing: Creating Media</p> <p>Children will learn to create detailed vector drawings using digital shapes and layering techniques. They show perseverance when refining designs, respect for others' digital work, compassion when supporting classmates, and service by creating purposeful graphics to help communicate ideas clearly.</p>	<p>Music:</p> <p>Children will explore Grieg's dramatic music through listening, composing, performing, and storytelling. They show respect for musical traditions, perseverance when creating motifs and ensemble pieces, compassion when supporting peers, and service by sharing their final performance confidently with others.</p>	<p>History: Ancient Greeks</p> <p>Children will discover what life was like in Ancient Greece, exploring myths, democracy, and influential ideas. They will develop respect for past cultures, show compassion when understanding people's experiences, use perseverance to grasp challenging historical concepts, and recognise service in how Greek achievements shaped societies.</p>
<p>Art / D.T: Sculpture</p> <p>Children will study traditional Greek vase designs and create their own using sketching, form-building and painting techniques. They show respect for ancient art, perseverance when constructing detailed forms, compassion when supporting peers, and service by presenting thoughtful, carefully crafted final pieces.</p>	<p>French</p> <p>Children will learn the days of the week in French, practise numbers up to <i>cinquante</i>, tell the time with increasing confidence, and take part in simple question-and-answer conversations to build everyday language skills.</p>
